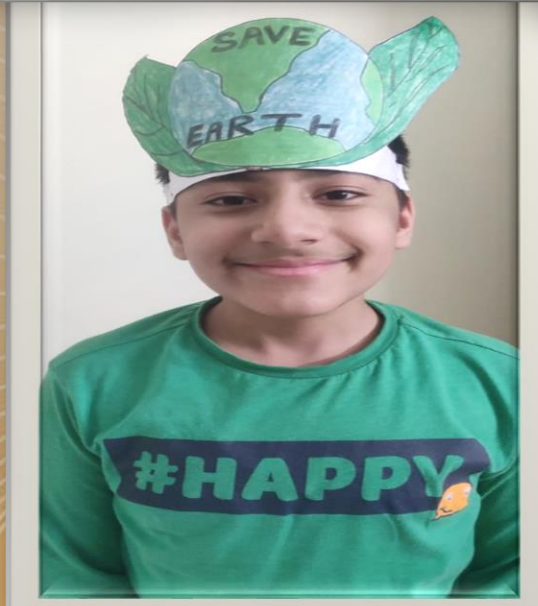

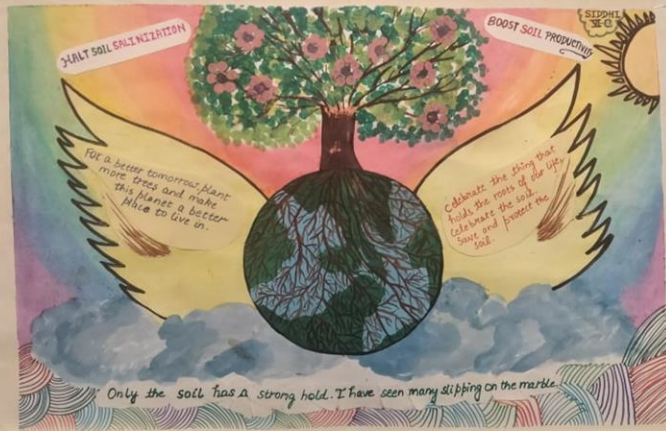
The school also initiated 'Prahari Club' to carry out the activities related to anti drug campaign.

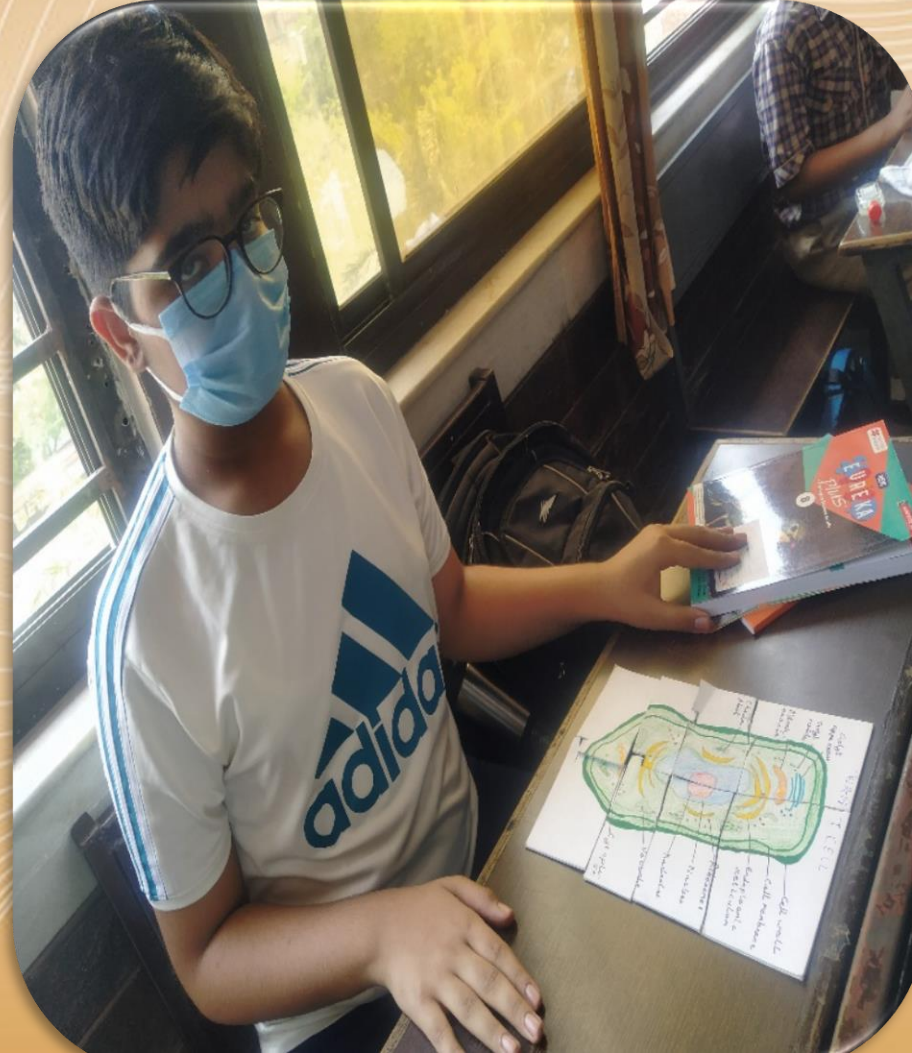
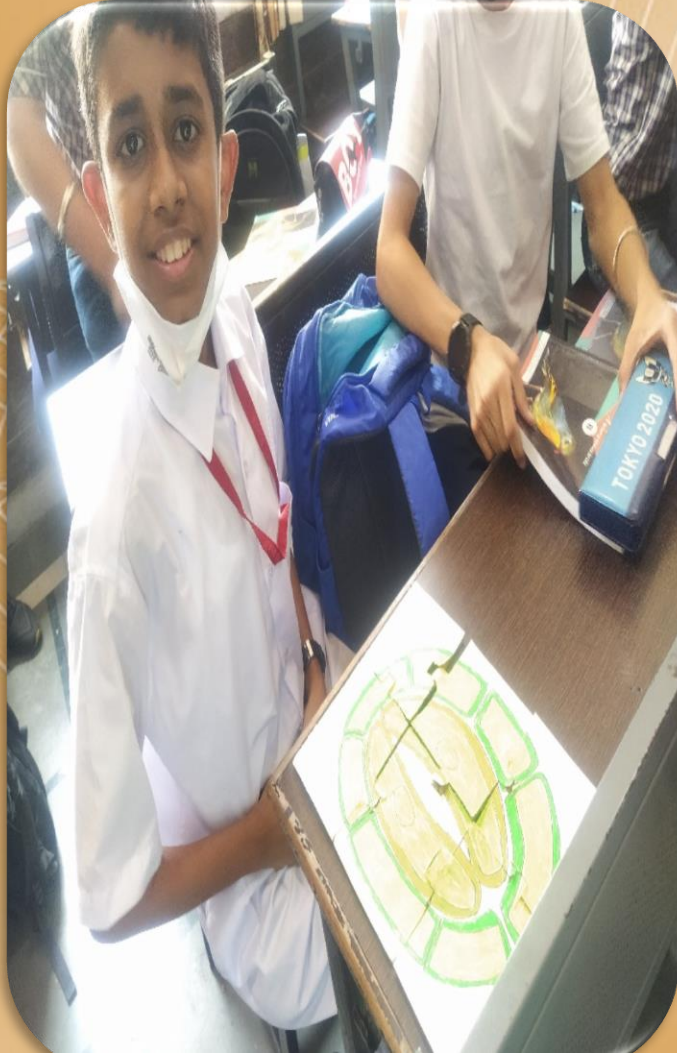
