
# REPUBLIC DAY CELEBRATION

# MENTAL TOUGHNESS WORKSHOP

**ASN Sr. Secondary School** organised a webinar on mental toughness for the Senior Wing on 28 December 2021. The webinar was conducted by Ms. Nandini Singh, associate psychologist at the Department of Mental Health and Behavioural Sciences, Fortis Healthcare.

In the webinar, Ms. Singh delineated the various attributes of mental toughness such as commitment, control, and challenge, while simultaneously providing practical tips and 'how-to's for achieving them. Ms. Singh illustrated the aforementioned points by presenting video snippets from interviews with famous cricketers such as Virender Sehwag, AB de Villiers, and Smriti Mandhana. The cricketers spoke about their own struggles that weighed them down, and how they overcame them.

The webinar concluded with a question-answer round that saw students bravely sharing their own struggles with time management and inferiority complex, which Ms. Singh acknowledged and resolved. Overall, it was a relevant and interactive webinar.
